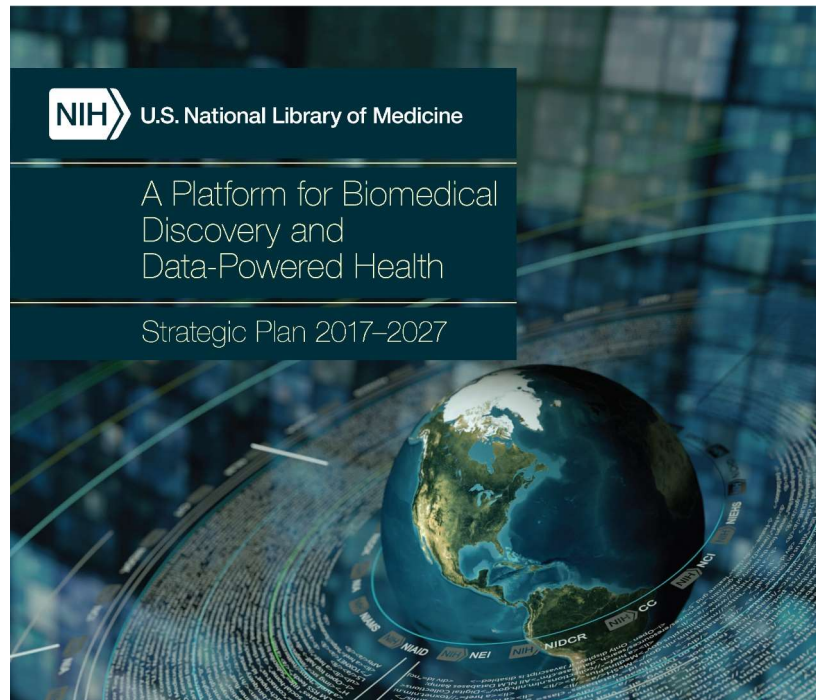

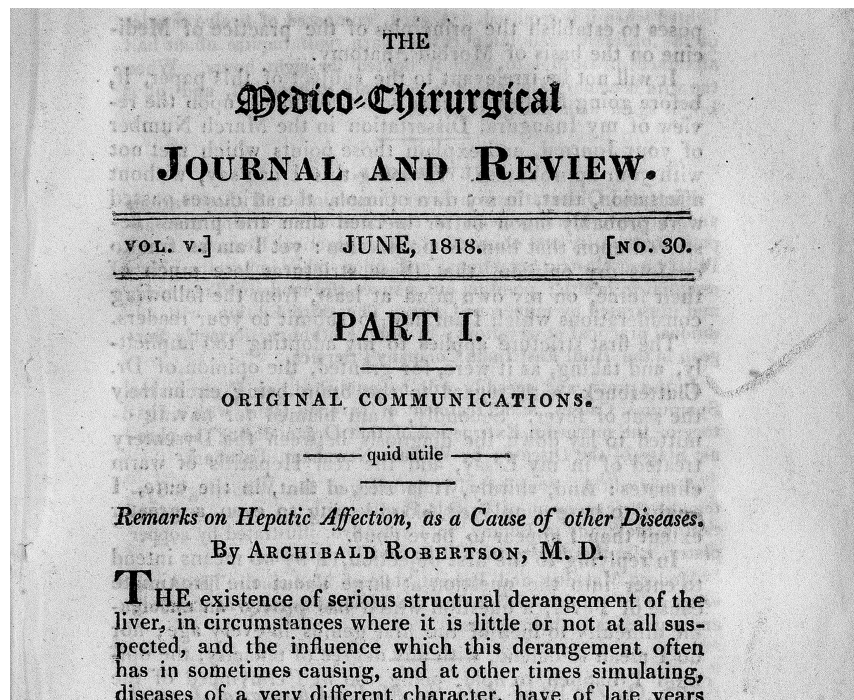
## **Locations of the U.S. National Library of Medicine (NLM) and its predecessor institutions, 1862 to the present**







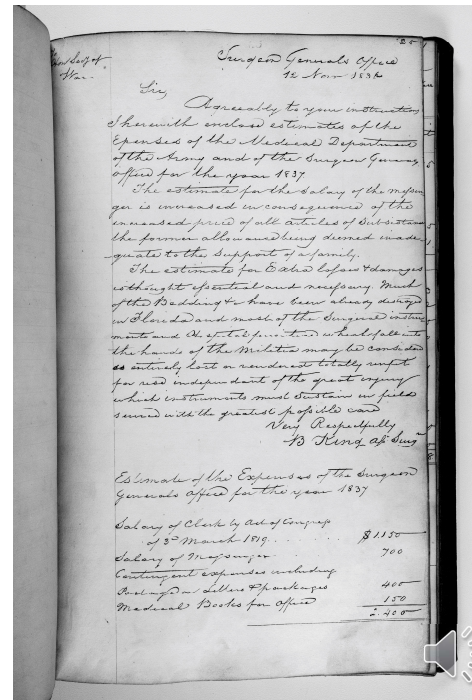

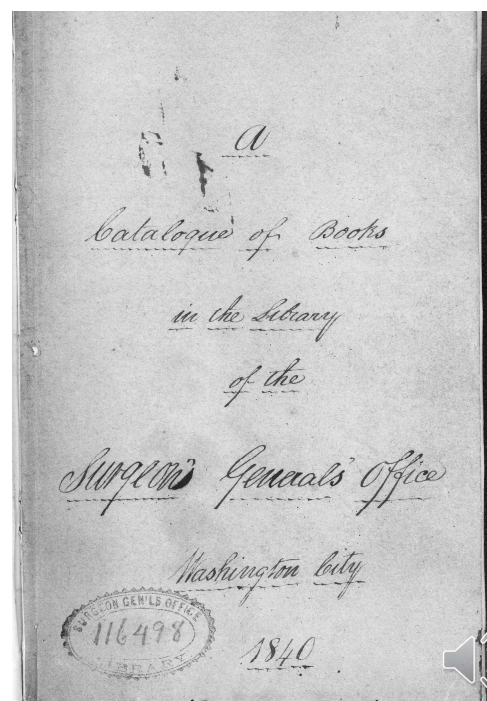
